SPEEDWAY SPORT

Speedway, slag - motorcycle races on oval-shaped tracks, one of the motorsport disciplines. Speedway players race for four laps, starting from the joint, beating the track in a counter-clockwise direction. The tracks used for slag competition have a loose surface, and special speedway motorcycles do not have a gearbox or brakes. This sport enjoys popularity mainly in Europe, in particular in Great Britain, Denmark, Sweden, Russia and Poland or to a lesser extent in the countries of Northern, Central and Eastern Europe, i.e. in Austria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Norway and Slovenia, in Latvia, Slovakia, Ukraine, Hungary and Italy, where there is even one active track for practicing this discipline. Outside Europe, the discipline is mainly in Australia, New Zealand and the United States, and regular competitions are also held in Argentina and South Africa.

The Polish name "slag" and the popular term "black sport" derive from the times when only black slag surfaces were used on tracks, currently replaced by special mixtures of syenite or granite. In the world, this sport is known as speedway.



CHILDREN'S DAY


The day established in 1954 by the General Assembly of the United Nations (UN) for the dissemination of ideals and goals regarding children's rights contained in the United Nations Charter (1945) and celebrated from 1955 on various days of the year in various UN member countries; in Poland (MDD) is celebrated on June 1.

In Poland:

In Poland and other former socialist countries, the International Children's Day is celebrated from 1950 on 1 June. It was organized for the first time in connection with the collection of signatures under the Stockholm Appeal. From 1952 it became a permanent holiday. Its initiator is an organization called the International Union for Protection of Childhood, whose aim was to ensure the safety of children from all over the world. From 1994 on that day, the Seym of Children and Youth was sitting in Warsaw.

On the occasion of Children's Day, schools often celebrate the day of sport; e.g. by organizing inter-class games.

Before World War II, on the initiative of the Polish Committee for Child Protection since 1929, the Children's Day was celebrated on 22 September. On this day, after masses in churches, children went to schools for the ceremonial academy, and then for prepared trips and games, during which sweets, bought from funds obtained from public collections, were distributed.
